

Call for papers. Clivatge #9

For the next issue of *Clivatge*, we shall prioritize those studies (whether theoretical or empirical ones) concerning the social consequences of the Global Pandemic of these days.

It is well known that we are in the middle of so broad a process of change—and conflict— that our journal *Clivatge* can only have the will of echoing the present transformations.

Furthermore, we think that the several disciplines which make up the “social sciences” (i.e., sociology, demography, political science, economics, anthropology, psychology, philosophy...) can and must offer us some orientations about these times’ real conditions and give us some indications on how we are acting and should act collectively in both the local and global levels, as well as some suggestions on what real problems are arising in the present situation— problems regarding the sphere of labour; the proliferation of the conditions and characteristics of social inequality; new emotional and psychological suffering; the difficulty for and the deficits of governance; new projects or demands around the managing of public good, especially concerning healthcare, educations or research. Social sciences can particularly help us to highlight the set of (positive and negative) trends that this Pandemic is imposing upon the development of social conflict and the possibilities of change; all in all, they can help us to better understand how the world and life in society are being reorganized and what directions we should be going now.

Subjects accepted for this issue and general guidelines:

- We shall select contributions abiding by the following terms:
 - 1) **Prioritized subject:** social consequences of COVID-19.
 - 2) Otherwise, contributions should comply with the **general subject matter** defining our journal *Clivatge*: studies (*analyses*) concerning **social conflict and change**, restricted to a specific temporal and spatial context, and taking place before the outbreak of the present pandemic or independently from it; and articles bearing *testimony* of a process of conflict and/or change and helping to identify its main actors.
 - 3) *Reviews* of recent works of interest to understand social life in specific societies and its possibilities for change and improvement.
- Format: preferably, text in Word; of between 7,000 and 10,000 words (analyses and testimonies; with the proper title, abstract, list of keywords and list of references For more information, visit:

- The accepted **languages** are: **Spanish, Catalan, English and French**.
- **Deadline for article reception: 31 March, 2021** (acceptance or rejection of articles will be communicated to authors in two weeks after reception).
- Planned date of publication: first week of May, 2021.
